The fourteenth session of the Group of Experts for the Global Sea Level Observing System (GLOSS) will be held at the CSIR-National Institute of Oceanography (Goa, India) during the week of 19-23 October 2015.

The week will start with a workshop dedicated to Indian Ocean Sea Level Science (19-21 October 2015). The workshop will be open to all interested persons, including those attending the GLOSS GE meeting. The workshop will have presentations covering many aspects of global and regional sea level variability including:

- Global sea level change
- Indian Ocean Sea Level changes, Mean sea level changes and Climate variability
- Extreme sea level changes, storm surges, tsunamis
- Sea level measurements (tsunami/ sea level network), continuous GNSS
- Impacts (Low-lying areas, mangroves, coral reefs) and Paleo sea level (Holocene), Archeological studies
- Special session on SARAL/AltiKa satellite altimetry data analysis for sea level studies

Students from India, countries in the Indian Ocean region and Asia are in particular encouraged to participate, as are students working with the Indo-French SARAL/AltiKa mission.

The GLOSS GE meeting will follow on Wednesday, 21 October (afternoon) to Friday, 23 October.

There is no registration fee to attend the Workshop.

IOC will be able to provide travel assistance to a few participants.
